Throughout the next eight months (two semesters) of training, we look forward to providing an excellent learning opportunity for all students (age 5 to late teens) interested in developing performing arts skills. Our professional teaching staff will provide instruction in the disciplines and techniques of dance, drama, musical theatre and vocal performance. Founded in 1991, NJYT is celebrated today as one of the finest youth-theatre companies in the State of New Jersey. In association with the New Jersey Performing Arts Center (NJPAC) since 1998, NJYT's free summer program continues to produce full-scale, professional theatre productions with all-youth casts and youth orchestras. This endeavor has introduced to young participants, and the population at large, not only cultural and classic theatrical events, but also lesser-known significant works rarely presented in the State. Last summer at NJPAC and the Algonquin Arts Theatre, NJYT presented a production of *Sweeney Todd, The Demon Barber of Fleet Street* to critical acclaim, and nearly forty five young performing artists participated and over six thousand people attended the performances.

Our participants in past productions have gone on to Broadway, prime-time television, movies and to major regional theatres across the country. As important, many have gone into first-rate theatre-arts programs at major colleges and universities. We are very proud of our students, past and present, and continue to encourage them to strive for goals they previously thought unattainable. Our motto holds true: "Anything Is Possible!"

1- Attendance at technical and dress rehearsals is MANDATORY for all students in the Cabaret.

DANCE CLASSES

Ballet I: Learn the standard ballet vocabulary, the positions, port de bras, and other ballet techniques. These classes consist of work at the barre, combinations in center-floor and across the floor. Students develop flexibility, strength, discipline and a good technical foundation, the elements necessary for all forms of dance. **Dress Code** - Ladies: Black leotard, pink tights, ballet shoes, hair securely pulled back off the face; Gentlemen: T-shirt, dance pants, ballet flats or jazz shoes.

Open Ballet: These classes supplement Ballet I. They enhance a student's basic technique and classical ballet training. Various levels of experience are accommodated in each class, from beginners to advanced. **Dress Code** - Same as Ballet I.

Ballet-Jazz I & II: These combination classes of ballet and jazz technique cover isolations, flexibility and strength exercises, with strong emphasis on turns, combinations in center-floor and across the floor that engage styles of jazz, funk, and Broadway dance from musical theatre productions. **Prerequisite:** For Ballet-Jazz I, you must be at least eleven years of age with a minimum of two consecutive years of Ballet within the last three years. Ballet-Jazz II is more advanced. **Dress Code** - Ladies: Dance pants can be added to the ballet attire, jazz shoes or sneakers (nothing bulky); Gentlemen: T-shirt, dance pants, and jazz shoes or sneakers (nothing bulky).

Beginners' Tap I & II: Learn tap vocabulary, basic tap steps and rhythms. These classes begin with tap exercises at the barre, then move to center-floor and across the floor covering simple combinations and turns; Tap II is slightly more advanced. **Dress Code** - Ladies: any color leotard and tights or t-shirt and dance pants, tap shoes; Gentlemen: T-shirt and dance pants, tap shoes.

Intermediate Tap III to Advanced: These classes go beyond Beginners' Tap II. Students focus on syncopated rhythms and syllables, more complex combinations and turns in center-floor and across the floor. **Prerequisite:** Minimum of two or more consecutive years of Tap II. **Dress Code** - Same as Beginners' Tap.

DRAMA, MUSICAL THEATRE & VOICE CLASSES

Drama: The art and technique of Acting. Various levels of drama classes focus on improvisation, character development and scene study. The beginning levels concentrate on basic skills, technique, losing inhibitions, and the building of confidence as a performer. **Dress Code** - Comfortable clothing, rubber-soled shoes.

Students seeking the Intermediate-II/Advanced Acting class are required to audition for the class. Audition Date: October 16, 2009; **Audition Requisite:** Prepare one-minute monologue.

Shakespeare Workshop: This series of classes explores the works of Wm. Shakespeare from an actor's viewpoint. Students are immersed in the heightened language through scene work, text analysis, character development, vocal technique, movement and improvisation. They gain a strong understanding of the classic works of Shakespeare, and flourish in the performing of some of the world's best known plays, monologues and sonnets by The Bard. Recommended for teens and young adults, ages 14+. **Dress Code** - Comfortable clothing, rubber-soled shoes.

Theatre Games for Kids: These unique and fun classes introduce young students to the world of theatre and drama through improvisation, movement, vocal work and classic storytelling techniques. Engaging theatre exercises and games encourage students to take creative risks and explore their world. All aspects of this class promote active listening and inspire each student to use his/her imagination in a proactive way. The students also benefit from working as a team, as well as from the power of telling their own stories. Recommended for children, ages 5 through 7. **Dress Code** - Comfortable clothing, rubber-soled shoes.

DRAMA, MUSICAL THEATRE & VOICE CLASSES

Musical Theatre: Various levels of Musical Theatre classes focus on song selection, presentation and interpretation for audition and performance; ensemble work; voice technique/projection; musical theatre movement and dance. **Prerequisite:** Student is required to take at least one dance class per week (preferably ballet) in conjunction with this class. Good working knowledge of dance vocabulary and proper dance technique is essential. **Dress Code** - any color leotard and tights, jazz pants (optional), jazz shoes, **(NO JEANS)**.

Voice: Private, individual voice classes concentrate on vocal technique, song selection, interpretation and/or coaching. Private lessons are limited to 15 students on a bi-monthly basis. Entrance into the Voice Studio is by audition only.

CHOOSE YOUR PAYMENT PLAN!!

- Half-Semester Tuition Plan - Minimum Payment Plan:** – Tuition for the first half-semester is due in full at time of registration. Payment for each subsequent half-semester is due in full on the Student's first class day in the week of **December 7, February 8 and March 29, when continuing for the school year. (Refer to "Class Schedule & Tuition" chart for pricing.)**
- Full Semester Tuition Plan or Discount Plan:** – Semester I Tuition is due in full at time of registration. Tuition for Semester II is due in full at the last class of Semester I **(Refer to "Class Schedule & Tuition" chart for pricing)**. This Plan provides a reduction in tuition and is recommended for students who take more than one class per week, or prefer to make two payments per year!
- Private Voice Lessons** are packaged in 4-lesson increments and require a 4-lesson minimum payment in advance. Tuition is due at the first lesson (starting at registration), and at every fourth lesson thereafter. **(Refer to "Class Schedule & Tuition" Chart for pricing.)**

OTHER FEES

Registration Fee: \$40. This is a nonrefundable, annual fee due at registration.

Late Fee: \$20 This fee is imposed when tuition is not paid on time in accordance with your "Payment Plan." The Late Fee, along with the Tuition payment, is due on the Student's next day of class **without exception** or Student will not be readmitted to class.

Check-Return Fee: \$35 This additional fee is imposed when your check is returned to NJYT due to insufficient funds or any other default issued by your bank. The full Check amount including the Check-Return Fee must be paid to NJYT **in cash** not later than one (1) week following NJYT's notice to you of the returned check.

Reinstatement Fee: \$30 This fee is due when Student elects to rejoin Class after three absences and has the prior approval to do so by the School's Artistic Director.

**** SHAKESPEARE WORKSHOP is structured for students no younger than 14 years of age.

SCHOOL POLICIES

Student Placement: Determined and governed by the School Faculty, a student's placement shall be commensurate with his/her level of skill and experience.

Absenteeism: Illness or emergency is considered an excused absence from class and, in such instance, the Student (or Student's parent or guardian) **must notify NJYT (908-233-3200) of the illness or emergency prior to the absence.** An absence from class for reasons other than illness or emergency shall require 12-hours advance notice to NJYT.

A Student with three (3) absences from a class for reasons other than illness or emergency will be suspended from that class and subject to a Reinstatement Fee (See "Other Fees"), if the student elects to rejoin that class.

A Student enrolled in Private Voice receives one lesson every two weeks (twice a month) for the period of his/her paid enrollment, which is a minimum of 2-months or 4-lessons. The time-slot for each lesson, which is assigned to the student at time of enrollment, shall remain the same from lesson to lesson. The school shall provide the student, within the first two weeks after his/her enrollment, with a Contact List of names and phone numbers of all the students enrolled in Private Voice lessons. **If, for reasons other than illness or emergency, a Voice student cannot attend his/her scheduled time-slot, then, within 48 hours prior to the student's absence the student or student's parent(s) or guardian must arrange an exchange of their lesson time-slot with another Voice student (on the Contact List), or find another Voice student (on the List) to take the vacant time-slot as an additional lesson. If the time-slot cannot be filled by another student, then the student intending to be absent will assume the cost of the lesson.**

Makeup Class: A Dance, Acting or Musical Theatre student returning to class from an excused absence may, in addition to that class, take any (age-/skill-appropriate) class of his/her choosing (except for Private Voice class) as a makeup. **A Private Voice student** returning from an excused absence may take an open voice slot (when available and only if the Student's recent payment covers that slot) or a musical theatre class (age-/skill-appropriate) as a makeup. **The makeup class for an excused absence is at no additional cost, provided that NJYT is notified of the absence within the hours specified under the Absenteeism policy above. Any unexcused absence does not entitle the student to a free class makeup.**

Registration Fee and Initial Class Tuition: Both are due at time of registration, either in cash or by personal check made payable to NJYT. **NEITHER WILL BE PRORATED OR REFUNDABLE.** Students who owe Tuition for prior-year classes will **not** be allowed in any class in the current year until back tuition is paid in full, along with a Late Payment Fee (See "Other Fees"). **Without exception, class tuition is to be paid in advance or on the day tuition is due for your selected Payment Plan.**

Changing Payment Plan: You may switch your "Payment Plan" only once in a semester. This may only occur within the first two weeks of the semester for the new Plan to apply.

SCHOOL POLICIES

Student Recital (The Cabaret): NJYT will showcase, in the form of a theatrical concert, review or other public presentation, the students it has nurtured throughout the school year in acting, musical theatre, dance and voice. A Student interested in participating in the Cabaret must meet **all the following requirements:** **a)** Class tuition for the year, including registration and any other fees, if applicable, must be paid in full in accordance with his/her payment plan; **b)** Student must not have more than three (3) unexcused absences in a semester; **c)** Student must audition for the Cabaret and, if selected, **must attend all technical and dress rehearsals** for the Cabaret; and **d) Student must attend his/her scheduled class(es) during the two weeks prior to the Cabaret performances.** If Student does not comply with all the above **(a-d)**, Student will **not** be permitted to perform in the Cabaret Recital.

(There is a NOMINAL ENTRANCE FEE for patrons of the CABARET: \$18-Adult; \$12-Child (under age 14). PROCEEDS FROM THE CABARET BENEFIT NJYT'S PROFESSIONAL SUMMER YOUTH-THEATRE PROGRAM.) (CABARET is subject to cancellation at the discretion of the Artistic Director.)

Studio/Facility Damage: Student and its parent(s) or guardian shall be fully liable for the repair or replacement of any part of the premises deliberately altered, defaced, mutilated, changed, or otherwise damaged by the Student.

Insurance: Student or Student's parent(s) or legal guardian shall maintain, at its sole cost, Primary Accident Medical insurance to cover Student while in class or on studio premises.



FACULTY



CYNTHIA MERYL (Acting, Musical Theatre & Voice Instructor) is the Artistic Director and Master Teacher for NJYT's School for the Performing Arts. A professional theatre arts educator for nearly forty years, she works with all age groups, elementary through college students, teaching acting and musical theatre classes, providing private training/coaching in voice, as well as free audition workshops to high schools throughout New Jersey. She is also Stage Director of NJYT's professional productions at NJPAC and other professional theatres in NJ. Her stage direction credits include over 35 major musicals and plays, twelve of which were produced at NJPAC alone such as last summer's critically acclaimed *Sweeney Todd*; *1776*; *Midnight Madness* (the new musical with Book and Lyrics by Cynthia Meryl, Music by Jack Bender); *Carousel* which

Peter Filichia of the Star Ledger called the "Best Surprise of 2007;" and *Ragtime, The Musical* which Mr. Filichia lauded as "Best Musical Revival," with Cynthia Meryl as "Best Director of a Musical" in New Jersey for 2006. Ms. Meryl has also directed and adapted for the stage a radio version of *A Christmas Carol*; and all of NJYT's Cabaret Recitals. Her performance credits as a professional actress include the original award-winning Broadway musical *Nine* with Raul Julia, Eliza in *My Fair Lady* opposite Noel Harrison, Nellie in *South Pacific* opposite Giorgio Tozzi, Charlotte in *Beyond Therapy* opposite Pat Paulson, and the list goes on.

CORINNE MUCHA (Ballet, Jazz Instructor): Trained in ballet at The Princeton School of Ballet & American Repertory Ballet, Ms. Mucha made her debut in *Children of the Drum* by Elaine Kudo. ARB credits include *Silkscreens* by Graham Lustig, Nightingale in the *Nutcracker*, *Concerto Borocco* by George Balanchine, *A Midsummer's Nights Dream*, and *Romeo and Juliet*, by Septime Weber. Ms. Mucha's guest artist credits include *Snow White*, *Cinderella*, Aurora in *Sleeping Beauty*, Mina in *Dracula*, *Pas de Trios* and Little Swans in *Swan Lake*. She has worked with choreographers such as Septime Weber, Alan Hineline, Adam Miller, Kate Thomas, Graham Lustig and Stuart Loungeway.



ALBERTA HANDELMAN (Acting Instructor) has taught acting in private and public schools in NYC and NJ for more than 25 years. While a professional actress and director, as well as Founder and past Artistic Director of the award-winning Blooming Grove Theater Ensemble, her greatest pleasure continues to be training young actors. She holds NJ Teaching Certificates in Speech Arts and Dramatics and in English. She earned an M.A. from Columbia University, a B.A. from Barnard College, and received theater training at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts and Northwestern University. She studied dance at the Lippel School and currently studies voice with Dr. Stephen Oosting. Credit highlights as an actress include the roles of Mrs. Cage in *Mrs. Cage*, Edna in *Prisoner of Second Avenue*, and Golde in *Fiddler on the Roof*. Her professional directorial credits include *Romeo and Juliet*, *A Man for All Seasons*, and the premiere of the operetta *Rappaccini's Daughter*.

KIMBERLY STRAFFORD (Acting): Kimberly Strafford has been teaching, acting, and directing for more than ten years. She has had drama teaching-artist residencies in classrooms throughout NYC public schools and a youth Shakespeare intensive. Strafford was Education/Outreach Officer for The Abbey Theatre-Dublin IRE, Artist-in-Residence for the Massachusetts Department of Mental Health, Curriculum Director for the Rebel Shakespeare Company, and facilitator for The Young Actors Workshop in Syracuse NY—a theatre group for young adults with Downs Syndrome. She currently serves as the Outreach Director for Kef Productions in NYC and is producing *Lyric Is Waiting* at the Irish Rep. Theatre. Kimberly earned her MA in Theatre Education from Emerson College and a BFA in Acting from Syracuse University. She has also trained extensively with Tina Packer at Shakespeare and Company. Acting Credits: *Love's Labours Lost* (Hudson Shakespeare Co), US tour of *Walk Two Moons* (Theatreworks USA), US tour of *The Yellow Dress* (Deana's Fund), *Cloak and Dagger* (The Rough and Tumble Theatre Co), and *A Wrinkle In Time* (Syracuse Stage).



EVAN EDWARDS (Tap II & III): A BFA graduate of Niagara University in upstate New York, Mr. Edwards has studied, performed and taught theatre arts all over the US and Europe. His performance credits alone number over 60 and include the premiere cast of *Miss Saigon* (in Germany), *My One and Only* with musical director Ken Leigh Rogers and choreographer Eileen Grace, *Anything Goes* with musical director David Loud, the North American premiere of *I and Albert* for Charles Strouse, *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* with choreographer Anthony Van Laast (in Essen, Germany); *A Standing Ovation* with Linda Eder, and *Evita* with choreographer/director Sam Viverito to name a few. As a director/choreographer, Evan has worked on such projects as *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* at Studio Arena, *Sleeping Beauty* at the Falmouth Playhouse, MA, *You're a Good Man Charlie Brown* in North Tonawanda, NY, and *Mama as She Became but Not as She Was* at The Clet Theatre, Lewiston, NY. Most recently, he was chief Designer for *House of Nunzio* at the Manhattan Theatre Source. Mr. Edwards' teachers and mentors include such dance masters as Beverly Fletcher, Broadway choreographer Randy Skinner, Germaine Salsberg, Crystal Chapman, Jeffrey Ferguson (Alvin Ailey), Raymond Chai (National Ballet of Portugal) Reiji Yabe (Nihon University, Tokyo). His teaching philosophy is to provide a supportive and positive environment that enables students in Tap to not only concentrate on technique, but to also focus on style, personality, and musicality - the dynamics of Tap sound. For learning to adapt style, energy and body language to suit the music, is what's most important. "It's not only about the steps. It's also about how you present them."



JAMES CAMPODONICO (Musical Director/Accompanist): Mr. Campodonico has taught vocal music for thirty-three years in the New Jersey public school system and has acted as musical director to over one hundred musical productions. An accomplished composer, his musical *Between The Lines* premiered at Luna Stage in Montclair and received the New Jersey Tony Award for "Best Musical Score Of The Year" from drama critic Peter Filichia of the Star Ledger. His musical *Murder On Broadway* also had a successful presentation at the York Theater in NYC last year. Mr. Campodonico's notable engagements include collaborations with the Paper Mill Playhouse, North Shore Music Theater, Luna Stage, Westbury Music Fair, Two River Theater in Red Bank, The Gateway Playhouse, and teaching musical theater classes at the Whole Theater in Montclair, NJ under the artistic direction of Olympia Dukakis.

DANIELLE MONDI (Open Ballet), has taught Ballet, Jazz, Hip Hop and Lyrical Dance to children ages four through 17 at local dance studios for the past three years. She is a member of the Erin Pride Dance Project Company of Paterson, NJ and has appeared at Plays in the Park (*Wizard of Oz Footloose, Aida, Cats, and School House Rock 2*) and New Jersey Performing Arts Center (New Jersey Youth Theatre's *Carousel*). Mondri recently graduated from Rutgers University's Mason Gross School of the Arts with a BFA in Dance. At Rutgers, she was a member of the University DanceWorks.



JENNIFER KUJAWSKI (Tap I), has trained in Tap, Jazz, and Ballet since age three. She became part of the New Jersey Youth Theatre (formerly WYACT) family at age 15, when she began taking its voice, dance, musical theatre, and acting classes. 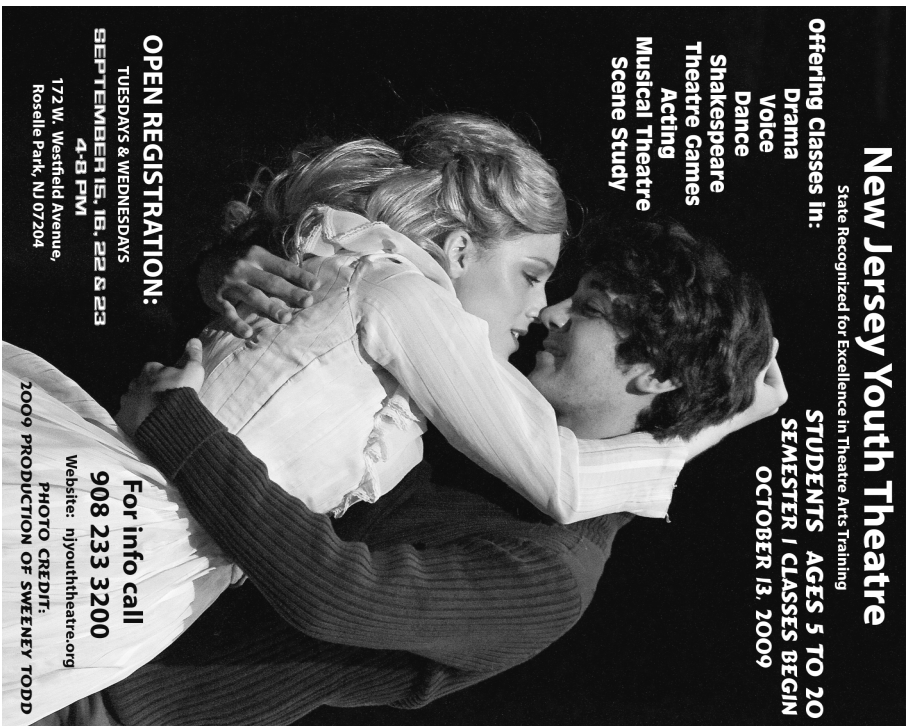
